Chapter co-hosts at least two (2) educational events with organizations from another, non-IFC fraternity/sorority council on campus such as the PanHellenic Council, National Pan-Hellenic Council, Multi-Cultural Greek Council, etc.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Signed letter(s) confirming that the event took place, the date, number of attendees, and a summary of the event, signed by an officer of the partner organization(s) <b>OR</b> professional overseeing fraternities.</li><li>2. Any documents related to the event(s)</li></ol>
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## About This Component

We are men of Culture, Harmony and Friendship. Demonstrate those values by collaborating with organizations from the other fraternity and sorority councils at your institution. Host a discussion to learn about the unique history and values of each of your organizations, or jointly host an event for the rest of your community.

## Best Practices

- Reach out to the presidents or officers of councils other than the IFC and request to co-host an event with the council or any interested organizations. Be sure that the program is applicable to all organizations as many fraternities and sororities operate with practices different from our own.
- Programs that the chapter is already putting on may count for this component if hosted with an organization from another council. For example, if a chapter is canvassing for the Red Cross, members of another organization may join and share in the educational experience of fire safety from the Red Cross.
