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## About This Component

Understanding the expectations of being a fraternity man and a Delta Sig are key to preventing one or more members from putting a chapter at risk. In the promise to be Better Men leading Better Lives, members are encouraged to discuss the meanings of these words and the Code of Conduct accepted by all members during initiation.

## Best Practices

- Give members a few questions to reflect on prior to the conversation. This way, each member will be ready to have the conversation with his own ideas.
- Invite an alumnus or well-respected advisor to speak to the chapter prior to any conversation.
- Draw up an outline for this and all educational events that resembles a script and has learning outcomes. What do we want our men to know about the Code of Conduct? What does our chapter define as a Better Man? How are the two related? Having questions prepared and an end-goal in mind will help a program run smoothly.
